Nation Ford Civil War Battery Donated to Land Trust

On Thursday afternoon, February 18, Mr. Warren Norman and the Kanawha Land Company presented Nation Ford Land Trust with a deed to an historic Civil War battery site. The 120 people who attended the preservation celebration at the Anne Springs Close Greenway Dairy Barn wanted to learn more about York County's War history, specifically, the gun pit that Confederate soldiers set up to protect the railroad trestle on Nation Ford Road. Guest speakers for this event were historians, Louise Pettus, author of *The Nation Ford Road* and other historical writings, and Sam Thomas, author of *Jefferson Davis in South Carolina*.

Mr. Ken Driggers and the Palmetto Conservation Foundation played a major role in the donation process of this historic site. Save America's Treasures is a White House Millennium Council initiative created by President and Mrs. Clinton as part of the National millennium Commemoration. It is a national effort focused on "protecting America's threatened cultural treasures..., including significant documents, works of art, maps, journals, and historic structures that document and illuminate the history and culture of the United States." Dedicated to the celebration and preservation of America's priceless historic legacy, Save America's Treasures works to recognize and rescue the enduring symbols of American tradition that define us as a nation.

The historic Nation Ford Civil War Battery, donated to the land trust in February of this year, has been named an official project of the *Save America's Treasures* program. We are very proud of this distinguished recognition and will work to preserve this site, a part of our local heritage, for future generations.

York County Forever

At its recent annual meeting, the South Carolina Association of Counties presented its top award to the York County Council. The county received the J. Mitchell Graham Award for York County Forever, its land preservation program adopted in 1998.

The judges said "it was basically fairly rare you see a county take on actions that are going to impact numerous generations in such a lasting manner." According to Holley Ulbrich with the Strom Thurmond Institute of Government, who was one of the judges, York County showed innovation and creativity with the York County Forever plan.

The Nation Ford Land trust adds its congratulations to York County and is pleased to have played a part in the development, along with Palmetto Conservation Foundation, of this far reaching plan. The Land Trust looks forward to a continued productive partnership with York County Forever.
