## Nation Ford Land Trust helps keep area clean through Adopt-A-Highway

On Saturday, March 17, members of Nation Ford Land Trust joined other groups across the county in an effort to clear our highways of litter. This is not necessarily a pleasant task but a necessity if we want to maintain the natural beauty of our communities. County-wide, 667 volunteers have participated in spring clean-ups collecting 1,447 bags or 21,996 pounds of garbage left on our roadways by uncaring individuals. Keep in mind there are other groups doing the same thing that are not associated with Adopt-A-Highway!

In addition to adopting a highway, the board members of Nation Ford Land Trust also agreed to adopt the Fort Mill Litter Task Force, making it an official committee of the land trust. The litter task force is made up of about 25 very concerned residents of the Fort Mill area. They are diligently working on projects which hopefully will deter people from littering our highways. One of their successes has been to establish a LITTERS hotline that can be used toll-free by all Fort Mill, Rock Hill, and Tega Cay residents to report litterers in the York County area. This LITTERS number (548-8377) is a local Fort Mill number that rolls to the Sheriff's office in York. Sheriff Bryant's staff will take the litter report and a code enforcement officer will contact the owner of the vehicle involved in the litter violation. The caller does not need to give his/her name but a tag number and a brief description of the vehicle is mandatory. The day of the week, time of day, and location of the litter offense is also important information. All local law enforcement offices have agreed to a zero-tolerance for litter violations. Thanks to a grant received from Palmetto Pride, the governor's council on beautification and litter, the task force will soon have bumper stickers available to promote this number. Pick one up at Earth Day or Fest-I-Fun and please put it on your vehicle to help this group in it's effort to swat litterbugs!

### Work begins at Civil War Battery Site

After months of filing for grant money and waiting for responses so the land trust could begin work on preserving this historic site, work is finally commencing. A matching funds grant has been received from the county's Tax Accommodations Fund for a much needed fence around the site to protect it from the work of vandals. Prior to erecting a fence, however, work by the Natural Resources Conservation Service will be done to ensure that the fence is appropriately placed so the existing vegetation required for stabilization of the site is not disturbed. Maryann Trent, a district conservationist from the York Service Center and James Erranti, a cultural resources specialist for South Carolina and North Carolina met at the battery site on Wednesday, March 28, to discuss work plans with Dr. John Schmidt, designated project manager, Hugh White, who is responsible for saving this site from excavation, and Carol Dixon, NFLT executive director. This site was donated to the land trust by Kanawha Land Company in 1999.

#### **Mission Statement**



### York County Forever

York County Forever was South Carolina's first local government acquisition program focused on open space and natural resource protection. The program was proposed to the York County Council by Nation Ford Land Trust and Palmetto Conservation Foundation in 1998.

The program has recently been working to begin a purchase of development rights program for rural property in York County. Through PDR's, landowners can sell the development rights to the county and keep the land in productive use. The Commission has identified threatened soil types, waterfront parcels and property adjacent to the county's special places as key targets for its PDR program.

### It's almost time for the spider lilies to bloom at Landsford!

We still have some of the prints made from a photo taken in May of 1999 by Ted Borg, a South Carolina nature photographer. They sell for \$100 each (includes shipping). The prints are 22" by 28" and every print is signed and numbered.

The proceeds from the sale of the print will be dedicated to the conservation activities of the land trust in the Catawba River Valley of South Carolina.

The Rocky Shoals Spider Lily is a rare plant which inhabits shoals in Piedmont rivers in the Southeast. The population at Landsford is believed to be the largest in the world!

#### From the Chairman

The South Carolina legislature is currently considering a bill to create a Conservation Bank. The purpose of this legislation would be to define a funding source to accomplish land conservation activities in our state.

The board of the South Carolina Conservation Bank would award grants for the purchase of fee titles or conservation easements on privately-owned lands that meet a certain criteria. Eligible fund recipients would be local governments, certain state agencies, and not-for-profit organizations such as land trusts.

The creation of the South Carolina Conservation Bank would be a tremendous asset to the conservation efforts of South Carolina and to Nation Ford Land Trust as well.

Please contact not only your representative but any member of the legislature that you know and encourage their giving positive consideration to this important legislation.
