2022 Highlights

- In September of last year, Andrew and Mary Lazenby placed the 71.4-acre Moonshine Prairie into a conservation easement. This site has a mix of Piedmont prairies and forested riparian areas. Named after a 1960's moonshine bust; Moonshine Prairie is being tested as a Piedmont prairie restoration site.
- One month later, our very first Cherokee County conservation easement was acquired. The Lazenby's 133.05-acre Blue Stone property is known for its range of elevation and thick hardwood forests. Blue Stone has stunning visuals of Kings Creek and its tributaries.
- Partnering with the S.C. Conservation Bank, York County Forever, and the Bethel-Lake
 Wylie Land Acquisition and Preservation
 Parks District, NFLT protected 86.32 acres on
 Hwy 557 named Woodsend Farm. The property sports rolling grasslands and a locally historic home sitting atop a hill beside two scenic ponds. In future years, the land will serve as a public greenway for the residents of District 2 with support for trails, equestrian activities, and a space for community events.
